

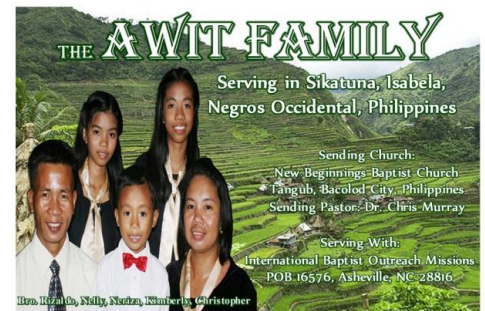
Murray Family Update

January 14, 2013...Two months from today, we are scheduled to land in Bacolod City. We have had a wonderful furlough but we are ready to go home to the work and to the people God has called us to reach. We have completed several projects throughout our furlough with only a few tasks remaining. With that in mind we want to bring these urgent needs to the attention of our praying friends.



Our church and college restroom is nearing completion. We had the previously estimated amount to complete this project. Unfortunately, due to one of our young men getting electrocuted and nearly killed, we had to bring in a professional to finish things up. This added to the budget. They plan to finish this within the week. The contractor has given us until February 15 to pay the total bill. We still need \$4000 to finish this project.

We are trying to raise the funds to build a house for the Rey Awit family, our church planter in Sikatuna, Isabela. They have an open air tabernacle type church building which is being used by unlawful and unrighteous people during the night. The local authority has instructed Rey to get something established as soon as possible. We need \$2000 to build a house and install the electricity. This will also provide electricity for the church as well.



With all of our church planters going to the mountains to start churches, we need a 4x4 vehicle in order to go visit them on a regular basis. Our desire is to go provide hands-on help, blessing them with materials and supplies, as well as holding them accountable for the support provided for them. Unfortunately, even second hand 4x4's are expensive. We still need \$8000 for this project.

We have one-third of our security wall completed. We still have two-thirds to go. Just recently, someone broke into our Deaf Church and stole our wiring for our restroom project. We will be having these problems until this project is completed. We still need \$12,000 to finish this project.



Brethren, the local church is the lifeline for the missionary. If we could go borrow from a bank or go to the field and get a job to help provide these needs we would. However, that is not possible. Our only option is the local church, God's avenue on earth to meet the needs of His servants. We present these needs to you, realizing that God must have an avenue to work through in order to meet these needs. Would you pray about being a channel of God's blessings for these projects?
