Yesterday, Tuesday, was a very good day and lots of progress was made. I only had one small crisis of pain late in the evening, but otherwise it was a successful day.

However, I am not out of the woods. After the trip home I am experiencing much tightness in the abdominal area, discomfort, and even some pain. The next couple of days at home should be very important for the progress. Hopefully my appetite will increase and my discomfort and pain will decrease. Please pray specifically for me to be able to sleep. At this point, I can only sleep sitting up or inclined as the reclining position puts way to much stress on my already distended abdomen. I praise the Lord that I am home but I also will be challenged here to get the exercise I need. Your prayers in the last two weeks during this ordeal have been greatly appreciated. In regards to my ongoing recovery, please continue to pray for a couple more weeks. Likely I will send more progress reports out in the days ahead but not as often as while in the hospital.

Pray also that God will give wisdom regarding decisions that need to be made in the days ahead. In closing, please pray for the 2013 Deaf Olympics Mass Evangelism Missions Trip. Souls are in the valley of decision. We need a strong team to reach these Deaf and hearing souls before it is eternally too late. This weighs heavily on my heart. May God bless you.
