Dear Friends,

"Great is the Lord, and greatly to be praised."

God graciously supplied my needs as I traveled to Ghana, Africa in February. A deaf man from Chicago, named Rocky Hall, traveled with me for two weeks. Rocky and his family plan to return to Ghana as full-time missionaries. Since returning from Africa, the Halls have begun full-time deputation.

We spent two weeks in the city of Kumasi, in the central region of Ghana. A team of missionaries serving in the Fundamental Baptist Church hosted us. They were a great blessing to us as we surveyed the city. We met deaf people everywhere we went, even when we were souvenir shopping. We were able to witness to many people, pass out tracts, and distribute many of our DVDs, which serve as a visual tract for the Deaf. We were able to attend a deaf club, a deaf gathering, a deaf school, and even attend the funeral of a deaf lady. We met many Deaf who are fluent in American Sign Language, and some who knew very little ASL. We met a handful of Deaf who are Christians, and even more who are Jehovah's Witnesses. That was sad, but I find that to be true everywhere I go around the world. It seems the JWs often arrive long before the Gospel does. Indeed, the laborers with the Truth are few!

We were able to invite some of those Deaf to a church service. Six Deaf came to church that morning! I requested permission to hold a separate Deaf class that morning, and Rocky was able to teach and preach for three straight hours. There was no break. Rocky was able to lead four of those deaf people to Jesus Christ! There had been some background, some foundation already laid in the past by someone, and Rocky was able to build

on that, and lead them to Christ! What a blessing that was for all of us, including those at the Fundamental Baptist Church.

I also had the privilege to preach in the church a couple times, and I focused on missions. Several decisions were made for which we praise the Lord. Both Rocky and I also had opportunities to preach in the Bible college chapel. It is wonderful to see what God is doing in cities, like Kumasi, all around the world. Indeed, God is still alive!

After Rocky left Ghana, I continued my ministry in the capital city of Accra, with IPM missionary, Pastor George Dapaah. We visited another deaf school twice. But the highlight of my time in Accra was with a deaf man named Charles, and Pastor Damoah. Charles came to know Jesus Christ by watching our DVD about a year and a half ago! This was the fruit of a trip to Ghana by several of our SWM missionaries two years ago. Amen! I was able to teach and preach to Charles during that week, and also worked diligently teaching his pastor, along with three other men, how to work with the Deaf. Pastor Damoah did not know any sign language, thus, Charles was coming to church every week without anyone to interpret any of the teaching or preaching for him. He has been sitting on a pew with no one to interpret the music, or anything at all. Yet, Charles keeps coming. Since being saved, and baptized, Charles has brought his mother and two sisters to church, and all of them have trusted Jesus Christ as Savior!

I will be returning to Ghana in July. I will be speaking to a group of national missionaries with IPM. I will also be training some men to work with the Deaf, and following up on ministry from February. From Ghana, I will most likely be traveling to the lvory Coast for two more weeks. I am looking forward to expanding our ministry into other countries in Africa, as well as around the world. I sure wish I had more help!

I am asking God to give me two men to travel with me to Ghana and the Ivory Coast this summer for about 5 weeks. If you are interested in more information, please contact me as soon as possible.

Please pray for this trip, that God would lead me to meet key people – in key places – at key times! To take advantage of the time we have before Jesus returns, I must work with leaders in these countries who can multiply our efforts to reach more for Christ. SWMI is small, but the impact we are having already is huge! In June 2014, we will have two new couples joining SWMI! What a thrill that is to my heart even now.

I also have trips planned for the fall to Puerto Rico, India, and Myanmar, known now as Burma. I am also looking for two serious men to travel with me to India and Myanmar! These men would be involved in the training I do, as well as in personal discipleship that I give to those who travel with me. It will be very intense, and life-changing!

Your prayers and financial support are not only welcome, but are greatly appreciated! Through you, SWMI, along with Vicki and me, is able to do more to reach the Deaf of this world for Christ. May the Lord bless you richly.
