I have some news that I know will be refreshing to your souls as my financial and prayer supporters. It is always my prayer that I will be a faithful messenger in sharing the gospel. I remember being told by my home pastor that the Lord often rewards faithfulness in handing out tracts by giving other unrelated opportunities to share the gospel and lead people to Christ. Recently, I had such an experience.

One Thursday, as part of my office duties, I visited the police station to turn in our application for a permit to hand out tracts for the next month. There was an unfamiliar officer on duty at the permit desk, and instead of merely accepting the application with the attached bilingual tracts, he commented on the title of the tract—"How to Go to Heaven." Since he seemed truly interested in whether we can know for sure, I handed both him and his assistant their own copy of the tract from my purse. I wasn't sure they would accept it there at work, but I was glad that they did.

I then proceeded to a nearby stationery store and noticed that a song from Handel's Messiah (which I love) was playing. As I made my purchase, I began to discuss the music with the owner. He told me he had sung the Hallelujah Chorus in choir when he had gone to a Christian high school. (There are several of these, colleges too, throughout the country, originally started by missionaries; but many are now Christian in name only.) Once again, I had the opportunity to share a bit about our church and give him a tract.

We have not seen any of these men come to church yet. However, the very next Sunday, we had several other Japanese visitors in our service. Following the morning service, the wife of one of our deacons came to me with one of the Japanese visitors, saying, "She wants to know how to become a Christian, but I can't explain in Japanese." So this young lady and I went into the Pastor's office, and I explained the plan of salvation to her, using the same gospel tract I'd been handing out just days before. She had previously attended a Japanese Christian university and her fiancé is a Christian; therefore, she already had some background to help her understand what we were talking about. After we went through the gospel plan carefully, she prayed to trust Christ as her Savior. Praise the Lord!
