I'm praying that we will be able to launch our new work in Tove, Kpalime by the end of this year. We already have

the plot of land purchased there last December. Please help us pray that the Lord will provide and direct us as to how to proceed. Pastor Pascal will be very instrumental for us there as he already lives in the area. Our desire is to start some construction works there as soon as the Lord provides. We also need construction for the work in Toumone where more than 50 adults and children gather in the open for worship. The Lord provided for 20 benches for the Toumone work.

The four churches in the north are doing well. Pastor Sambiani is keeping really busy there. The yearly convention in the north will be hosted by one of our churches in Dapaong, Lord willing, in February 2018. As we prep for this, I'm praying about ways in which the Lord will have us assist them. I'm hoping that I will be able to make the trip there next year.

Our Christmas Gift Bags Project for this year is in order. To ensure that the gift bags reach the children on or around Christmas day, we kindly request that they be sent to our Mission Board around September 1. We're doing just Ziploc bags this year. Things to include in the bags are about 8 to 10 items (usually \$1 items) such as toys, hard candies, school supplies, toothpastes and brushes, etc. We encourage you to please include \$5 with each bag to help with packing and shipping. We're making plans to reach more children for Christ through the project this year. A family can pack a bag and help pay to ship it to a girl or boy in Togo for \$15 or less. Please prayerfully consider being a part of this once-a-year ministry individually or as a church.
