Reaching The Unreached At Your Doorstep And Around The World

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Was "a god" or was God correct in John 1:1c?

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Those of you who have dialoged with Jehovah's Witnesses (JWs) know that they will read from the Watchtower's (WT) New World Translation (NWT) to try to prove that Jesus is not God. One of their main objections comes from the last part on John 1:1 as quoted here: In [the] beginning the Word was, and the Word was with God, and the Word was a god.

Many WT followers are taught superficial arguments that reference the Greek and rules that they have made up that would justify the use of "a" before God. The truth is that when their rule is applied to other verses like these (John 1:6,12,13,18) and many more, there is no "a" and lowercase "g" used for God. Usually at the end of the dialog the JW feels like he has proven his point and the NWT's "a god" is correct. Maybe the best reply would be the most obvious one and the simplest one to use.

At the beginning of your conversation, it is imperative to get the JW to agree to the context and harmony rules. The harmony rule (no truth in Scripture will contradict itself) will show that the WT's "a god" is an obvious impossibility.

To begin your conversation just ask the JW this question: "Do you know how anyone would know that a god in John 1:1c is not correct? Answer: If a god were correct, then Genesis 1:1 would have to say, "In the beginning a god created the heaven and the earth instead of God, otherwise the Scripture would not harmonize and it would contradict itself."

Gen 1:1 KJV In the beginning God created the

heaven and the earth.

Now let's take a look at John 1:1-3 and ask ourselves some questions that will give us more understanding — John 1:1 *In the beginning was* the Word [Jesus], and the Word [Jesus] was with God, and the Word [Jesus] was God. 2 The same was in the beginning with God. 3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. Let's start with In the beginning. In both Genesis 1:1 and John 1:1, in the beginning is an inference to God's eternal existence without any point of origin. In the beginning applies to all three statements made in John 1:1, e.g., in the beginning existed Jesus, in the beginning Jesus existed with God, and in the beginning Jesus was God [God the Son or the Son of God].

John 1:2 simply restates that in the beginning Jesus was eternally with God. John 1:3 is a corollary to verses one and two. It is the reasoning involved in concluding that Jesus is the Creator of all things. In other words, the natural conclusion following verses one and two, which is stated in verse three is that Jesus must be and is the Creator of all things.

Genesis 1:1 NWT In [the] beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

John 1:3 NWT All things came into existence through him, and apart from him not even one thing came into existence.

Not even one thing would include Michael the Archangel, who is the WT's created Jesus. May the Lord help us to reach JWs with the truth!
