Dear Friends,

Greetings from your brethren in the Lord. We thank the Lord for His provision and working through us. We are all doing well by His grace. It's the rainy season here. Therefore we're enjoying much cooler temperatures. We thank the Lord for that.

Here, school is still in full swing. Delays have been accumulated over the years in our school calendar owing to the political instability and the constant strikes by school teachers. Final exam days start early next month and will continue through the first part of August. This means that summer holidays will official start late August. We're praying that the Lord will help our Sunday school children as they prepare themselves for the exams.

The work in Tove now has a church building. Doors will be put on it this summer.



The brethren there are very excited. As we have plans to move Pastor Mensah Kokou (Bro. Pascal) down south for the pastorship of the church in Sanguera this summer, we're in prayer for a suitable God-fearing man to fill the gap in Tove. We already have a candidate but

we need your prayers as we seek the Lord's mind on this.

The construction in Toumone is also going well, nearing completion. Six people have been saved there this quarter. Many are now showing a more favorable disposition to going to church. We're anticipating more salvation decisions there and a surge in the overall church attendance in the coming months. Please be in prayer as we look into finding and training a man to take it over from Pastor Sambiani, our northern ministry supervisor, who is already surcharged. Elsewhere, 15 souls received Christ and 11 baptized.

The Lord is finally answering our prayer about Afagnan. We're working on the final details for the acquisition of a plot of land for the church. Another trip is being organized there, Lord willing, later this month. During our last visit there, we made some contacts. It was evident to us that several people are impatiently awaiting the start of a good Bible-believing church. There are a few churches in the area but, according to the locals, those are fraught with problems and doctrinal issues that have caused many to be wary of churches. As is usually the case, the good reputation of Baptist churches are anew whetting the desire of some of them for worship. The fact still remains that they are

still unsaved and are in need our Savior. Please pray for us as we seek to evangelize them in the coming months. Please pray also for the provision for a church building there. We will keep you abreast.

Another thing for which I'm so thankful to the Lord, an answer to prayer, was the opportunity that we had to show an educational video to the public high school students in Sanguera on the scientific evidences for biblical creation. School officials including the principal were there throughout the projection.



I had sent a formal request by letter to the high school principal last year. That our request was granted was nothing but the Lord's doing. This is because our government does not favor religious activities in public schools. We were not able to present the gospel but the impact has been made. The school officials were very appreciative of the program.

We're continuing to reap benefits from our Children's Christmas Project. The church in Tove has gained a family through it. The man, Justin, unchurched at the time, was deeply touched by the program that he made up his mind to join the church there. With his family, he started coming to church the second week after the distribution of the Christmas presents. Not long after that, he gave his life to the Lord. We're praying for the salvation of his wife also.

Already, preparations are in progress for this year's project with some new churches deciding to join the program. The Christmas presents are expected at our mission board's address by September 1.

We also held our Annual Easter Convention in April. It went well, though not as up-lifting as the previous ones.

I also remarked a decrease in the attendance. Efforts will be made to ensure a better conference next year.
